#### Letter from a Churchwarden

When considering what to write I couldn't help thinking about an incident which happened to us in France many years ago.

We arrived in France with our touring caravan at about midnight having crossed the English Channel on a ferry from Dover. We set off from Calais on a main road south intending to spend the night parked at motorway services which was a common practice in those days.

A few miles along we became stopped in a traffic jam which was not moving at all. After some time a Frenchman who spoke little English eventually got us to understand that there had been an accident and that the road was completely blocked. Furthermore it would be several hours before it would be open again. We understood that we had to turn round (no mean feat doing a U-turn with a touring caravan in limited space) and that we needed to go through a village called Boisbois (I am not sure if this is the correct spelling even now?)

Eventually we found a minor road to Boisbois. This was before mobile phones and satnavs! Boisbois seemed to be a village square with no street lighting and several roads leading from it. As we couldn't see any road signs, we tried the first road, only to follow a large loop of a road back to the village square. Other roads from the square had the same result: back to the square each time. At last we found a very narrow road, it would have been impossible to pass a vehicle coming the other way, which seemed to go on for several miles when it opened up to join a main road.

We had more by good luck than good management come out at the other side of the accident. We stopped at the first motorway services, put down the legs on the caravan when another British caravan pulled up alongside us. The driver told us that they had been following from Calais as they had not been to France before and thought 'we looked as if we knew where we were going and they had decided to follow us as least until we were well out of Calais'.

Next morning we were able to continue our journey without further incident.

This event reminds me of our relationship with God. Without His guidance and input it is easy for us in our lives to drift round and round in circles without getting anywhere. Once we accept Him into our lives then we have the Holy Spirit to show us the way.

May the love of God, the salvation of Jesus and the presence of the Holy Spirit be with us all, all whom we love, and all His people everywhere, now and always.

**Roof Appeal** As you probably know, a large amount of lead was stolen from the south aisle Church roof during 2018.

The cost of replacing this lead, together with a new 24 hour monitored roof alarm, will be in the region of £45,000.

So far the roof appeal has reached just under £29,000. This is made up of £7,500 from our insurers, a £5000 donation for the new roof alarm, and £16,000 from other donations and fund raising events.



We are still looking for further donations to make up the shortfall as well as support for our fund raising events. This would be very much appreciated. Thank you for considering this urgent need.


